Letterfinlay foods of Fort William supply us with quality smoked and unsmoked bacon, pork sausage, free range eggs, smoked salmon, haggis and black pudding.

Letterfinlay Scottish Smoked Salmon is smoked in their Corpach smokehouse, using only traditional oak smoked methods giving the salmon its unique, full flavour

Stornaway Black Pudding

A delicacy made exclusively in Stornaway on the Isle of Lewis. Granted a geographical indicator of origin in 2009 by the EU, black pudding produced in Stornaway is the only product allowed to carry this title. Black pudding is made from beef suet, oatmeal, onion, blood, salt and pepper. Charles Menendez Macleod otherwise known as 'Charlie Barley' set up Charles MacLeod Ltd in 1947 and his strict quality guidelines are still used to this day.

MacSween's Haggis

Established as a butchers shop in Edinburgh in the 1950s MacSween's use a traditional recipe of lamb, beef, oats, onions and spices to create a spicy mince. The haggis is closely associated to Robert Burns through his 'address to a haggis' poem and traditionally eaten at Burns' suppers on 25 January.
